

Lot 2 James Martin Village- Development

Good news on the progress of developing the disused aged care facility on Lot 2 at James Martin Village. Stage 1 of the work on changes to the southernmost building has now commenced; with demolition of the internal walls. Building certification has been finalised, following some changes required to the final plans. We can now progress full steam ahead. If everything goes to plan it is hoped that we may welcome the first residents towards the end of this year.



The final plans (as above) allow for us to include a two bedroom apartment (unit-A1), as well as five one bedroom apartments. We will also be building carports for each unit; this will include extending the car park at the southern end of the building. As I have mentioned previously, these will be offered under subsidised entry agreements, including both one-off payment and on-going payment.

Remaining development:

With the first stage underway, we are now considering the future stages. We already have the concept plan, which includes a further seven apartments and new roadway to service them.

The plan is in the process of being updated to include the rest of the building. Considerations include further apartments, new administration area, new community facilities and kitchen area, plus car parking to service these facilities.

Timing of the development will depend upon funding. If we are able to secure any grants, it would help us to complete it sooner. The concept plan will provide us with a clear vision to present for any grant applications.

James Martin Village - Additional Units

Now that the first of the new 3 bedroom units at James Martin Village have been completed, planning for the remaining units is underway. Our plan is building a further six residences along the roadway and we are in the process of updating the plans. These units will again be three bedrooms.

It is expected that the building will begin later this year.

Current Villages Vacancies

While the number of vacancies has slowed a little compared to last financial year, we are finding that vacant units are continuing to sell fairly quickly. New Administration Phone System

A new phone system has just been installed in the Administration Office. This system is a computer based unit in lieu of the more traditional system we used previously.

Pets in the Villages

A reminder to all residents of GCRH's Pet Policy. Overall, we have a no pet policy, however, new residents may be approved by the Board to bring a current pet with them, under the following conditions:

- The unit is suitable for a pet.
- That pet is not to be replaced.
- It cannot disturb or annoy other residents.

Current residents may be allowed to have a pet for a special need. This would require a letter from a doctor or health professional and require Board approval.

Unless the Board has approved it, residents should not have a permanent pet at their residence.



Memory Lane – Laurel & Hardy!

Laurel and Hardy were a British-American comedy duo act during the early Classical Hollywood era of American cinema, consisting of Englishman Stan Laurel (1890–1965) and American Oliver Hardy (1892–1957).

Starting their career as a duo in the silent film era, they later successfully transitioned to "talkies". From the

late 1920s to the mid-1950s, they were internationally famous for their slapstick comedy, with Laurel playing the clumsy, childlike friend to Hardy's pompous bully. Their signature theme song, known as "The Cuckoo Song", "Ku-Ku", or "The Dance of the Cuckoos" (by Hollywood composer T. Marvin Hatley) was heard over their films' opening credits, and became as emblematic of them as their bowler hats.

Prior to emerging as a team, both had well-established film careers. Laurel had acted in over 50 films, and worked as a writer and director, while Hardy was in more than 250 productions. Both had appeared in The Lucky Dog (1921) but were not teamed at the time. They first appeared together in a short film in 1926, when they signed separate contracts with the Hal Roach film studio. They officially became a team in 1927 when they appeared in the silent short, Putting Pants on Philip.

They remained with Roach until 1940, and then appeared in eight B movie comedies for 20th Century Fox and Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer from 1941 to 1945. After finishing their film commitments at the end of 1944, they concentrated on performing stage shows, and embarked on a music hall tour of England, Ireland, Wales, and Scotland. They made their last film in 1950, a French–Italian co-production called Atoll K.

They appeared as a team in 107 films, starring in 32 short silent films, 40 short sound films, and 23 full-length feature films. They also made 12 guest or cameo appearances, including in the Galaxy of Stars promotional film of 1936. On December 1, 1954, they made their sole American television appearance, when they were surprised and interviewed by Ralph Edwards on his live NBC-TV program This Is Your Life. In 2005, they were voted the seventh-greatest comedy act of all time by a UK poll of professional comedians.

A movie was made in 2018 called Stan and Ollie starring John C Reilly as Oliver Hardy and Steve Coogan as Stan Laurel. It was set during the aforementioned post war tour of Britain. It is a great tribute. Below is one of the last pictures ever taken of the pair together.
