Town of Gawler - Ageing Well Framework


I recently attended a forum regarding the Town of Gawler's Ageing Well Framework draft document. Effectively it is designed to assist the town in planning for the support of older people in the community.

It will fit within the town's strategic planning, providing some direction for the council. It was developed after consultation and feedback from people in the town.

It is a positive document in that it does provide some guidance for all stakeholders, not just the council on the needs for older people. The real key to how good the framework is, will be on if/how the actions identified are followed through.

We provided some feedback on behalf of GCRH, as a major stakeholder within the Gawler Community. One action proposed within the document is to consider an "Age Friendly Advisory Group to advocate for older people within the community. Something we would like to see and be part of.

2022-23 Budget Considerations

As mentioned earlier, we have faced a quite a bit of change to our draft (April) budget due to the current inflationary issues. The final budget isn't approved until August, after the end of year figures are finalised.

The main increases to note are:

Gawler Council Rates, up 3.5%.

Insurance increase now confirmed as 5%.

Annual Wage Review, increase of 4.6%.

CPI end of March up 5.1%, expected to be higher at end of June.

In terms of the increase to Services Fees, we are hopeful that we can keep them at close to half of the CPI increase at the end of March.
