#### From the General Manager's Desk

Things are ramping up at James Martin Village and we will soon be welcoming more members to the GCRH family. It is interesting to see how we have advanced from 11 units nearly 55 years ago and will soon have 159 total residences.

In Chairperson Helen Sands annual report to the residents, she has noted how the additional units will provide benefits for everyone.

Nearly a decade ago a Masterplan for James Martin Village was produced for future planning. Since, we have purchased the facility at Lot 2. So, we are updating the Masterplan; we hope to have it for the residents meeting.

## **Annual Residents Meeting - All Villages**

The Residents Annual Meeting will be held at the Humphrey George Community Hall at James Martin Village, 19 Dawkins Avenue, Willaston on Wednesday 30<sup>th</sup> October commencing at 10.30am.

All residents should have received the audited village statements for 2023-24; which will be discussed at the meeting. The statements are provided in a consolidated version covering All Villages.

#### **Services Fee Increases:**

The new Services Fee information has also been provided with your invitation to the annual meeting. As mentioned in the last newsletter, we had been budgeting on an increase closer to 3%. However, with a lesser than expected council rates increase and more certainty on income from the James Martin units, the increase is lower. The average increase for services fees for 2024-25 is 2.13%, which compares to the CPI increase of 3.8% at the 30<sup>th</sup> June 2024.

# **Palliative Care Connect**

Palliative Care can be a challenging path to navigate for individuals and their families. The SA Department of Health & Wellbeing have recently introduced Palliative Care Connect. It provides a suite of services for enhancing access to palliative care and bereavement support in SA.

Palliative Care Connect provides information and linkages for individuals and families navigating life-limiting illnesses. It serves as a link between primary health networks, specialist care services and community-based organisations, ensuring a seamless network of care provision.

A dedicated information line offers assistance to individuals, families, friends, carers and healthcare professionals alike. The Palliative Care and Bereavement Navigators are ready to assist individuals to make informed decisions and access appropriate services and can also help with symptom management, advance care planning, support packages and linkage to psychosocial supports.

#### **Bruce Eastick Complex – Apartments Update**

We have some news on the progress of the power board for the six apartments in the Bruce Eastick Complex. Completion has been delayed because of the power, but we now expect the board to be ready for installation in mid-November. The installation may result in power disruption in James Martin Village on the day. We will provide prior notification to residents when this will take place.

Remaining external work has started with extension to the car park underway. Conduit for electrical work, including for future stages will be installed; this will allow concrete paths and fencing to be installed.

Once we have confirmation on the power board dates, we will be sending out letters to invite applications for the Subsidised Entry apartments.

### **New Units at James Martin Village**

We are getting fairly close to the first three of the new units at James Martin Village being ready. The builder is putting some finishing touches on them; then we will have the fit-out work completed. (See the vacancies).

The remaining three are also likely to be completed by the builder over the next month. With the fit-out to follow and Christmas intervening, they should be advertised either side of the new year.

## Hard Waste - NAWMA Option

We have provided a waste pick-up option to all residents over the years. For basic easy to dispose of items, we charge a \$10 fee. However, on occasions we have been asked to pick-up bigger items, such as lounges and beds. While we are able to do this, it is important to note that we have to put them in the bin at James Martin Village. There is a charge that we pay for this bin, so we charge based on how much weight it adds in this bin.

Residents should also be aware that NAWMA will do one free hard-waste collection for you each financial year. This is for Gawler ratepayers, which all residents are. You can arrange with NAWMA by ringing 8259 2100 and booking the disposal. You then leave the items booked on the footpath the night before collection is due to take place. If you would like to know more ring the office and we can provide you with details.

Also, if you have electrical or electronic items to dispose of (not whitegoods), there is a bin at Bunnings. Evanston, where you can leave items. Includes TV's and computers.

## **Current Villages Vacancies**

The following are the current vacancies that are available for viewing:

## Unit 27 - 29 James Martin Village, 19 Dawkins Ave

These are the first three or the new builds at James Martin. They are 3-bedroom homes with a large living area and large kitchen. The main bedroom has an ensuite and robe; while bedroom 3 also features a robe. The main bathroom includes a second toilet and the large laundry features plenty of storage. There is also a large linen cupboard near the bedrooms. The kitchen features modern draws for ease of access and cooktop, wall oven, rangehood as well as dishwasher and microwave provisions. Garage is under the main roof, with drive through option, plus alfresco in rear courtyard. These are available for viewing now. Price range \$430,000 to \$470,000.



## Unit 9 Governor Daly Village, 20 Daly Street

Two bedroom unit with near new kitchen. Has timber floors throughout and will have a full repaint. Kitchen was installed in 2022 and includes a dishwasher. Will have new split unit a/c and has a ceiling fan in the main bedroom. Both bedrooms feature sliding door robes. Bathroom has a large shower and there is a separate toilet. There is a full sized laundry; the laundry & linen cupboards are to be replaced. Has a full length front verandah and excellent rear courtyard with decking. Comes with a detached garage and solar system. Price range \$310,000 to \$330,000.



The 6 subsidised entry apartments at James Martin Village will be advertised shortly; also, the remaining three bedroom units 30-32.


